## **Male Uretheral Sling**


The AdVance<sup>™</sup> XP Male Sling System is a synthetic mesh-like surgical tape that is placed in the area of the urethra that is causing a problem. It acts as a "hammock," repositioning and supporting the urethra to help restore normal bladder control. The sling helps keep the urethra closed, especially when coughing, sneezing, and lifting and allows the patient more control over their bladder, reducing leaks.

## **Artificial Urinary Sphincter**

The AMS 800 Artificial Urinary Sphincter, a working mechanism, is a three-part urinary control system that is contained completely in the body used for men who have become incontinent because of their urinary sphincter. It is placed inside the body, where the fluid filled cuff helps keep the urethra closed and a pump allows urination on demand.
